Elections of members of the Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC)

Please find next information related to the elections of members of the SAC, which will take place at the upcoming meeting of the Conference of the Parties (CoP) from June 4-5, 1998, in Arlington, USA.

Background Information:

I. Agreement Establishing the IAI – Article VII

- The Scientific Advisory Committee shall be the principal scientific advisory organ of the Institute.
- 2. The Scientific Advisory Committee shall be composed of ten members elected by the Conference of the Parties to serve in their personal capacity for three-year terms and with eligibility for a single additional term. The Conference of the Parties shall elect six Scientific Advisory Committee members from nominations received from the Parties; three from nominations received from the Scientific Advisory Committee itself; and one from nominations received from the Institute's Associates. These members shall be scientists recognized internationally for their expertise in areas relevant to the objectives of the Institute, ensuring broad subregional, regional, and worldwide representation, as well as representation from a variety of disciplines relevant to global change research.

II. Standing Rules of the Conference of the Parties

Chapter XI: Election of members of the SAC

Rule 65: The Scientific Advisory Committee shall submit a slate of no less than twice and not more than four times the number of vacancies to be filled.

Rule 67: All candidates nominated must have a curriculum vitae that fulfills at least the requirements set forth by the Agreement.
