His areas of research are focused on understanding impacts of Global Change on Agriculture, Forest and Water Resources and the development of adaptation strategies for these sectors. He has been lead investigator of several national and international grants and main advisor of a dozen of graduate students. He has also served as member of the advisory committee on Climate Change for the ministry of agriculture in Chile.
