



How regional offices work with regional organizations such as IAI to support the work of IPBES

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UNESCO and IAI

- UNESCO especially through its Regional Office for S&T in Montevideo has a longstanding cooperation with IAI
- IAI and UNESCO/Montevideo have establishment of a new Regional Centre on Climate Change and Decision Making based in Montevideo. Cooperation is foreseen with Ministries of Education, Science, Environment, Industry and Mines, Agriculture and Livestock, etc.; Universities from MERCOSUR; Foundations; the South American Institute for Resilience and Sustainability Studies (SARA(S)); the Climate and Development Knowledge Network (CDKN); and the International Development Research Centre, IDRC
- Focus of the institute is on capacity building; work multistakeholder in nature
- UNESCO recently signed a regional agreement with IAI and ICSU LAC on the creation of a consortium broad context of global change and sustainability and in the more specific context of Future Earth. Disaster risk reduction and sustainable energy were identified as priority areas

UNESCO field presence

- A global organization
- 58 offices in 110 countries
- 10 regional, 27 cluster
- Other national (programme design)
- 10 Category I, 81 category II
- Future: multisectoral regional offices
 - Coordinate strategic contributions to the formulation of regional strategies
 - Run technical consultations with regional and subregional organizations

UNESCO and IPBES

- Support substantive, in-kind and financial to IPBES functions and work programme
- Elements related to knowledge generation and to ILK
 for example
- The Busan outcome and IPBES' scales of work
- The need to rely on relevant institutes and centers and to triangulate with the IPBES UN partners – UNESCO in particular with regard to identifying and catalyzing relevant knowledge

Lessons learned

- Different characteristics and priorities of the regions
- Field presence and action must be specifically tailored to and capitalize upon those characteristics and priorities
- Success factors:
 - Presence of relevant partner organizations
 - Expertise, facility provisions and budgetary capability
 - Political commitment
 - Quality of personnel, operations and deliverables

IAI – UNESCO – IPBES: a possible model

- IPBES rigorous but flexible and 'opportunistic' in its operations
- IPBES Busan principles building on existing structures...
- Examples, test cases, lessons to be drawn
- The UNESCO-IAI collaboration model (also in relation to the relation between UNESCO an IPBES) can provide a useful model to this end
