The Earth System Governance Project is the largest social science research network in the area of governance and global environmental change. My duty as a regional coordinator is to connect researchers in South America interested in devoting some of their work to the very much needed research on topics of accountability, adaptiveness, the architecture of the earth system governance, the agents that drive the earth system governance, and the conflicts about access and legitimacy.

The other part of my work is at Adapt-Chile, a new non-profit organization formed with colleagues interested in supporting municipalities to adapt to the impacts on climate change. We have done some work in Santiago de Chile and we hope to be able support municipalities in other parts of the region as well. We have so far focused our work on developing a methodology for undertaking vulnerability assessments and construct, together with the local community, responses to the challenges identified.
