Polo Diaz is a Professor of Sociology and Social Studies and former Director of the Canadian Plains Research Centre (CPRC) of the University of Regina, Canada. He teaches primarily in environmental issues, social science methodology, social theory, and development. His publications include books, articles and book chapters on climate change and vulnerabilities, social capital and social cohesion, processes of change in rural communities, forestry markets, Latin American development, and rural marginality. He has participated in several research projects in Canada and Latin America. These include studies on the different dimensions of rural vulnerability and adaptation to climate hazards; climate governance; the social cohesion of the farm community; processes of diskilling of farm labor; regional sustainable development, environmental policies, rural organizations and movements; the economic and social changes of farm households and communities; and forestry development. Dr. Diaz is currently involved in two main research projects: a study of the impacts of droughts on Canadian rural communities and an international project on the impact of extreme climate events on agricultural producers in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Colombia, and Chile.
