Objectives

The São Paulo School of Advanced Science for a Sustainable and Inclusive AMAZONIA (SPSAS

AMAZONIA) is sponsored by the São Paulo State Research Foundation (FAPESP), and will be held from 21st of November to o5th December the Hotel Fonte Colina Verde in São Pedro/SP, Brazil. It is organized by the FAPESP, BIOTA/FAPESP Program, University of Campinas, the Inter- American Institute for Global Change Research (IAI), the National Institute for Amazon Research (INPA), Emilio Goeldi Museum (MPEG), Mamirauá Sustainable Development Institute, Amazon Environmental Research Institute (IPAM) and the Brazilian Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (BPBES).

The objective of this School is to provide young postdoctoral fellows (and PhD candidates) with a multi and interdisciplinary vision, based on science and valuing indigenous and traditional knowledge, of the main problems that have historically hindered sustainable development, conservation, and social inclusion in the Amazon. It also aims to discuss the existing alternatives to these fronts and jointly build with early career scientists, new proposals to solve these problems.



Program

The SPSAS AMAZONIA is structured into 3 main Modules:

Module 1 - The Amazon territory and its sustainability;
Module 2 Amazonians as protagonists of biodiversity
conservation and climate change mitigation; and
Module 3 - The Amazon and its inhabitants in harmony with their
environment and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).

The SPSAS AMAZONIA will be conducted in portuguese, spanish and english with simultaneous translation English-Portuguese and English-Spanish.

Speakers

More than 30 renowned researchers in the field from 5 different countries will be the speakers at The São Paulo School of Advanced Science for a Sustainable and Inclusive AMAZONIA.



Who can apply?

SPSAS AMAZONIA is for early career researchers that have earned their PhD from 2015 onward. Exceptionally PhD candidates (graduate students, currently registered in the last year of their Doctoral/PhD courses), can also be accepted. We encourage applications from students from different academic disciplines (natural, social, and human sciences, engineering, communication) provided their academic work and study is related to the themes of the school and related topics.

Approximately 90 applicants, 45 from Brazil and 45 from other countries will be selected to participate in this School of Advanced Science. Priority will be given to participants that have been born or have carried out undergraduate courses in the region, and are studying the Amazon in their research or thesis. Indigenous and Afro-descendent candidates will also be eligible for bonuses during the selection process, at the discretion of the Organizing Committee

Participants will be selected based on the quality of their curriculum vitae, by the analysis of the letter of interest, in which the candidate must describe the reasons that led their to enrol in SPSAS Amazon and how their participation will benefit their research in the future, and by the analysis of the letter of recommendation.

To promote the diversity of the SPSAS Amazonia participants, equity in ethnic and gender representation will also be considered.

Letter of recommendation

issued by your Supervisor on letterhead if you are a PhD student, by the Principal Investigator of the project you are engaged with if you are a postdoctoral fellow, or by your former supervisor(s) if you are an early career researcher

If you are a PhD student:

- A 1 page (1200 characteres max, including spaces) summary of your research project, with Title, Summary, Key Words and your supervisor's institution.
- Document from your university attesting that you are enrolled in the final year of your PhD program

deadline for applications: 19 August 2022



Funding

FAPESP will cover the costs of accommodation and meals for selected participants. The funding does not imply any institutional relationship with FAPESP or remuneration in kind.

Limited funds are available to cover the travel costs of participants whose institutions cannot afford such costs. Please indicate if your participation depends on these travel subsidies to pay for your tickets, as accommodation and meals are already covered by the organization.

Each foreign participant will have to bear the costs of health insurance for the duration of the SPSAS Amazonia (if you are not able to cover this cost please, contact the School's organization).

The final acceptance in the SPSAS Amazon will depend on sending the receipt of your Travel Insurance to the organization of the School.

Certificates
