

Collaborative Research Actions

To apply, each research consortium must have members from least 3 countries and funding from 3 resource partners







Immobility in a changing climate (ITHACA). Brazil

Topic: Reasons to stay (by choice or constraints) and why people return after being affected by climate impacts.

Human Mobility, Global Challenges, and Resilience in an Age of Social Stress (PHOENIX). Uruguay, Argentina, Brazil

Topic: How climate (im-)mobilities and their social tipping points are shaped by socio-cultural contexts and the psycho-social health of populations.

International migration, climate change, and network effects: A worldwide study. Chile, Argentina

Topic: A global framework to study the influence of climate change on migration and analyzes the role of neighboring countries on migration flows.

Total funding: US\$444,000




















Amazonia and Tropical Forests: Global Implications and Need for Urgent Action CRA



Co-led by IAI and FAPESP

- •Recognizes the pressing challenges and opportunities to meet the targets under the Sustainable Development Goals and the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework.
- •Acknowledges differences in governance, cultural diversity, and territorial configuration across tropical forests.
- Aims to coordinate research projects with a transdisciplinary, participatory approach to develop innovative solutions to these challenges.
